Every student has to mandatorily register online with the UGC Antiragging portal and submit affidavits in the Proctor’s office before they register in their respective Programmes. Placement of CCTV cameras at appropriate places to monitor if any incidents of ragging takes place, frequent and sudden checks in hostels with the help of anti ragging squads, arranging for seminars and other activities in order to aware students about the serious effects of Ragging etc are done by the Proctorial Board under the supervision of the Chairman, anti Ragging cell. 

- Value added courses are being planned for each of the department.
- Category of slow Learners and poor language learner is being targeted specially.
- Laboratories (with workshops) for all departments having lab component including for B.Tech departments are being duly augmented. Ten computers have been purchased and installed for the computer engineering lab.
- Central Library is being equipped with due automation.
- Placement cell has been initiated.
- Gram Pravas, Yoga, Pranayam initiatives are being strengthened.
- Funds and endowment enhancement are being pursued.
- All the Deans are being enthused to organise seminars/workshops on important themes and developments in their areas and bring out proceedings.
- All Ph.D. Scholars have been instructed to observe discipline of “non plagiarism” in their thesis and research papers.
- Improvement of Faculty by way of their participating in seminars, workshops, conferences, refresher courses, winter/summer schools etc. is being promoted.


