NOTIFICATION

Whereas the Central Government is empowered under Section 3 of the University Grants Commission (UGC) Act, 1956 to declare, on the advice of the UGC, an institution of higher learning as a "deemed-to-be-university".

2. And whereas, a proposal was received from Nehru Gram Bharati, Vishwavidyalaya Kotwa-Jamunipur, Dubwali Distt. Allahabad seeking status of "deemed- to- be -university" under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956;


3. And whereas, the University Grants Commission have examined the said proposal and vide their communication No.F.6-54/2005 (CPP-I) dated the 12th June, 2007 have recommended conferment of status of "deemed-to-be-university" to Nehru Gram Bharati Vishwavidyalaya under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, initially for a period of 3 years;

4. Therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, the Central Government, on the advice of the University Grants Commission (UGC), hereby declare Nehru Gram Bharati Vishwavidyalaya comprising of Rajiv Gandhi P.G. College a period of 3 years, with effect from the date on which the aforesaid College is disaffiliated from its affiliating university, viz., Ch. Sahuji Maharaj University, Kanpur, subject to the condition that the status conferred upon the Nehru Gram Bharati Vishwavidyalaya will be reviewed by the UGC with the help of an Expert Committee before the expiry of the 3-year period. The status shall be confirmed only on the basis of the inspection and assessment report of UGC's Expert Review Committee and subjected to nullification of its present shortcoming as pointed out by the Expert Committee.

5. The declaration made in para 4 above is subject to further conditions mentioned at Sr. No.3 of the endorsement to this Notification;



6. Neither the Government of India nor the University Grants Commission shall provide any Plan and Non-Plan grant-in-aid to Nehru Gram Bharati or its constituent teaching units.

UGC shall ensure that the review that is required to be conducted as per this Notification, is held sufficiently in advance, so that a decision on the continuation or otherwise of the status is enabled before the expiry of the said three-year period.
2. The Director, Distance Education Council, Indira Gandhi National Open University, Maidan Garhi, New Delhi.
3. The President, Nehru Gram Bharati, Kotwa Jamunipur, Dubwali, Distt. Allahabad, U.P. Para 4 of this notification shall be further subject to the following condition that
 - (i) The management of Rajiv Gandhi P.G. College shall legally vest with Nehru Gram Bharati the Society created to manage the affairs of the deemed-to-be-university institution.
 - (ii) All the moveable and immovable assets of Rajiv Gandhi P.G. College, should be transferred and vested with the Nehru Gram Bharati formed to manage the 'deemed-to-be-university' institution, and registered as such in the interest of future of students, members of faculty, employees and for maintaining the standards of higher education. A report on compliance in this regard shall be submitted to the UGC and this Ministry at the earliest.
 - (iii) Nehru Gram Bharati and the society that will be managing it, should not undertake or engage in any activities that are of commercial and profit making in nature.

- (iv) The corpus fund created by the Nehru Gram Bharati Society should be irrevocable in nature and should not be liquidated without the prior consent of the UGC. Accordingly, Nehru Gram Bharati shall submit an undertaking in this respect to the UGC immediately and also take necessary action in consultation with the UGC to ensure irrevocability of the corpus fund.
- (v) The academic programmes being offered or to be offered by Nehru Gram Bharati will conform to the norms and standards prescribed by the relevant Statutory Councils such as the UGC, AICTE, etc. Nehru Gram Bharati shall not offer / award, as the case may be, any degrees that are not specified by the UGC. Nehru Gram Bharati shall also ensure that the nomenclatures of the degrees, etc. to be awarded by it are specified by the UGC under Section 22 of the UGC Act, 1956.
- (vi) Nehru Gram Bharati shall not start new academic courses without obtaining prior approval of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and/or the concerned Statutory Councils such as MCI, AICTE etc., as the case may be.
- (vii) Nehru Gram Bharati, as a deemed-to-be-university, shall award degrees in respect of the courses run by the institution mentioned in para 4 of this notification only to those students who are admitted subsequent to the date of this notification. Accordingly, it shall make admission and enrolment of students to the academic courses of the said college under it (i.e. under Nehru Gram Bharati only with effect from the ensuing academic year (i.e. from 2008-2009).
- (viii) As for the students who were already admitted to Rajiv Gandhi P.G. College prior to the date of this notification, they shall continue to pursue their courses of study under affiliation to the present affiliating university, namely, Ch. Shahuji Maharaj University, Kanpur which shall conduct examinations for them and award degrees to them upon successful completion of the courses/programmes of study they are pursuing at the college presently.
- (ix) All the prescribed norms and procedures of the relevant Statutory Councils, such as UGC, MCI, AICTE etc. and other authorities concerned in the matter of admission of students, intake capacity of students, starting of new courses/ programmes, renewal of approval to the courses, etc. will continue to be in force, and shall be adhered to by the Nehru Gram Bharati.

- (x) Nehru Gram Bharati shall not conduct any distance education programmes without prior approval of UGC and Distance Education Council (DEC). The guidelines issued by both the DEC and the UGC from time to time in the matter of imparting education through distance mode have to be complied with by it.
- (xi) Nehru Gram Bharati shall not start and run any study centre / off-campus centre / offshore campus without obtaining the requisite prior approval of the UGC/ Government of India, as the case may be.
- (xii) As and when necessary, the Nehru Gram Bharati Society shall suitably amend and update its MoA/Rules in consultation and in concurrence with the UGC. Specific changes/amendments, if any, suggested by the Government of India or UGC shall also be carried out by the deemed-to-be-university institution in its MoA/Rules with the approval of the UGC.
- (xiii) Nehru Gram Bharati shall strictly abide by all the norms and guidelines as laid down by the UGC and other Statutory Councils such as Medical Council of India, AICTE etc. from time to time, as are applicable to institutions notified as 'Deemed-to-be-Universities'
- (xiv) Suggestions, if any, made by the UGC's Expert Visiting Committees during its visit at the institute or in its inspection report submitted to the UGC, should be followed by Nehru Gram Bharati so as to rectify deficiencies, if any, to bring about the recommended improvement.



Accordingly, Nehru Gram Bharati shall submit an undertaking in this respect to the UGC immediately and also take necessary action in consultation with the UGC to ensure irrevocability of the corpus fund.
- (v) The academic programmes being offered or to be offered by Nehru Gram Bharati will conform to the norms and standards prescribed by the relevant Statutory Councils such as the UGC, AICTE, etc. Nehru Gram Bharati shall not offer / award, as the case may be, any degrees that are not specified by the UGC. Nehru Gram Bharati shall also ensure that the nomenclatures of the degrees, etc. to be awarded by it are specified by the UGC under Section 22 of the UGC Act, 1956.
- (vi) Nehru Gram Bharati shall not start new academic courses without obtaining prior approval of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and/or the concerned Statutory Councils such as MCI, AICTE etc., as the case may be.
- (vii) Nehru Gram Bharati, as a deemed-to-be-university, shall award degrees in respect of the courses run by the institution mentioned in para 4 of this notification only to those students who are admitted subsequent to the date of this notification. Accordingly, it shall make admission and enrolment of students to the academic courses of the said college under it (i.e. under Nehru Gram Bharati only with effect from the ensuing academic year (i.e. from 2008-2009).
- (viii) As for the students who were already admitted to Rajiv Gandhi P.G. College prior to the date of this notification, they shall continue to pursue their courses of study under affiliation to the present affiliating university, namely, Ch. Shahuji Maharaj University, Kanpur which shall conduct examinations for them and award degrees to them upon successful completion of the courses/programmes of study they are pursuing at the college presently.
- (ix) All the prescribed norms and procedures of the relevant Statutory Councils, such as UGC, MCI, AICTE etc. and other authorities concerned in the matter of admission of students, intake capacity of students, starting of new courses/ programmes, renewal of approval to the courses, etc. will continue to be in force, and shall be adhered to by the Nehru Gram Bharati.

- (x) Nehru Gram Bharati shall not conduct any distance education programmes without prior approval of UGC and Distance Education Council (DEC). The guidelines issued by both the DEC and the UGC from time to time in the matter of imparting education through distance mode have to be complied with by it.
- (xi) Nehru Gram Bharati shall not start and run any study centre / *off-campus* centre / *offshore* campus without obtaining the requisite prior approval of the UGC/ Government of India, as the case may be.
- (xii) As and when necessary, the Nehru Gram Bharati Society shall suitably amend and update its MoA/Rules in consultation and in concurrence with the UGC. Specific changes/amendments, if any, suggested by the Government of India or UGC shall also be carried out by the deemed-to-be-university institution in its MoA/Rules with the approval of the UGC.
- (xiii) Nehru Gram Bharati shall strictly abide by all the norms and guidelines as laid down by the UGC and other Statutory Councils such as Medical Council of India, AICTE etc. from time to time, as are applicable to institutions notified as 'Deemed-to-be-Universities'
- (xiv) Suggestions, if any, made by the UGC's Expert Visiting Committees during its visit at the institute or in its inspection report submitted to the UGC, should be followed by Nehru Gram Bharati so as to rectify deficiencies, if any, to bring about the recommended improvement.

The University is expected to take action in accordance with endorsement 3(viii) regarding students already enrolled with it at the Rajeev Gandhi P.G. College as per the assurance given by it vide its letter Ref. No.CSJMBB/Rcamp/149-2/2007 dated 3.7.2007.

This is to bring to your kind knowledge that the Standing Committee of Legal Education Committee of Bar Council of India by virtue of its meeting held on 18th November 2023 considered the matter of Faculty of Law, Nehru Gram Bharati (Deemed to be University), Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh.

The Standing Committee considered the reply dated 31.10.2023 received from Faculty of Law, Nehru Gram Bharati (Deemed to be University), Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh alongwith other documents. After consideration, extension of approval has been granted to Faculty of Law, Nehru Gram Bharati (Deemed to be University), Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh for imparting three year LL.B course with intake of three sections of 60 students in each section and five year BA LL.B course with intake of two sections of 60 students in each section for a period of two years i.e. for the academic years 2023-2024 and 2024-2025.

Further, as far as the request for one additional section in three year LL.B course is concerned, the CLE needs to apply afresh for the next academic session after rectifying the deficiencies.

Specific conditions imposed by the inspection team and approved by the Committee which are required to be complied with are as follows :-

- **Internet Connectivity:** CLE has poor internet connectivity, it must be improved.
- **Faculty:** CLE has appointed 34 faculty members and a Dean. There is lot difference in the salary of faculty members – some are getting Rs 15900, some Rs. 23000 and Rs 37000. CLE is paying Faculty members below the UGC scale. CLE should give salary to all its teachers as per UGC scale and through bank transfer only. CLE must maintain student-teacher ratio 40:1.
- **Classrooms:** CLE has 23 numbers of furnished classrooms. Classrooms did not have teachers tables and chairs. Classrooms should have two doors. Few classrooms had less than 60 seats. During inspection many of the classrooms were locked, hence could not be checked. Teachers table and chair needs to be there. Sitting arrangement for 60 students needs to be made. The overall infrastructure needs to be improved. CLE must increase the number of classrooms to accommodate the new courses.
- **Library:** Library of CLE should properly be maintained. CLE should buy more reference books & text books of latest edition worth minimum of Rs Five (05) Lacs relating to the proposed course. CLE should also develop e-library by subscribing to e-law journals of repute and by buying e-data based law journals in terms of clause 15 of Schedule III of Rules of Legal Education.
- CLE has subscribed to E-database – SCC Online. Due to power cut CLE could not demonstrate SCC to the inspection committee, so it is recommended that all subscription bills should be submitted to BCI.
- **Moot Court:** There is a Moot Court Hall. There are 3 crown chairs for Judges. Moot Court room is satisfactory.
- CLE to put the Moot Court under the management of some senior Professors and a regular practicing advocate and to maintain a regular record of all its activities, along with photographs of various activities. Moot Court exercise to be done on regular basis to ensure that each student participates in it. CLE to ensure that moot court exercises, court visits and internship in terms of clause 24 of Part II (B) of Schedule III of Rules of Legal Education, 2008 are done on regular basis.
- **Legal Aid Clinic:** CLE has established a Legal Aid Clinic on the ground floor. CLE maintains activity register. CLE should provide free legal aid services to public at large of the locality by adequate publicity in collaboration with the District Legal Services Authority as per Clause 11, Schedule- III of Rule 11, Legal Education Rules, 2008.
- CLE to put the LAC under the management of some senior Professors and to maintain a regular record of all its activities, along with photographs of various activities
- **Common Rooms:** CLE has Boys' and Girls' Common Room. There are only chairs and tables. CLE has separate sports and recreational room. There should be more chairs and tables with indoor games.

In the Girls' Common Room there are beds without curtains, vending machine and chairs. There is an attached washroom in the Girls' Common Room. CLE must put curtains alongside the bed.

AFFIDAVIT-

- ✓ ---An undertaking of complying with all the conditions mentioned above must be fulfilled/submitted to BCI within 15 days of receipt of this letter.
- ✓ Thereafter compliance has to be done at the earliest, within a period of 6 weeks from the date of receipt of this letter. A compliance affidavit (duly notarized) along with supporting documents has to be filed within the same period.

You are requested to kindly note that you will be required to seek extension of approval of affiliation for the above said course/s after approval of affiliation given by BCI ceases.

Further details regarding payments including any Institutional Development fee etc, due, if any, shall be intimated to you in due course.

You may kindly bear in mind that the Bar Council of India is the sole and supreme sanctioning authority for seats and as a general rule it does not allow any supernumerary quota of seats for law degree courses, over and above the sanctioned strength of seats and whatever reservation of seats is to be done by the University as a general rule has to be done within sanctioned strength of seats.

A. Conditions/Rules of Legal Education regarding which compliance affidavit has to be filed.

----Further kindly ensure to furnish authenticated and signed bank statements of salary transferred to your faculty bearing bank stamp/seal and signature of the bank manager for a period of three months with effect from the date of receipt of this letter for the preceding period of three months must be furnished immediately. This must be continued to be submitted every three months without fail.

Kindly also furnish purchase receipts of Indian Bar Review and other minimum Library requirement, failing which the Centre of Legal Education shall be liable to the natural consequences, which may include revocation of recognition/approval granted.

Centre of Legal Education (CLE) as defined under the Rules of Legal Education stands for the following and is being reproduced below for convenience:

“Centres of Legal Education” means (a) All approved Departments of Law of Universities, Colleges of Law, Constituent Colleges under recognized Universities and affiliated Colleges or Schools of law of recognized Universities so approved.

Provided that a Department or College or Institution conducting correspondence courses through distance education shall not be included.

B. The Centre of Legal Education is directed to ensure compliance of the conditions stipulated above and also comply with Legal Education Rules 2008, failure of which may lead to subsequent necessary and proper action being taken in this regard :-

1. The **Centre of Legal Education** is directed to **ensure establishment and continuance of a Legal Aid Centre** as per Clause-11, Schedule-III of

Rule-11 of the Part-IV of the Legal Education Rules – 2008, CLE **should keep activated** Legal Aid Clinic.

2. **Centre of Legal Education** must ensure to teach clinical subjects and give marks as per the schedule.
3. **Centre of Legal Education** should ensure the payment of salary to teachers as per Rules 22 schedule III, Part IV of BCI Rules.
4. The library should be furnished as per Clause 15 of Schedule III of Legal Education Rules 2008 given below :-
Minimum Library requirement: To start with, a Law Library shall have a set of AIR manual, Combo offer of CD of AIR Pvt. Ltd. (containing electronic version of AIR Supreme Court and High Court Data bases Research 1950-2015 (four connections each) Cr. L.J. Data Base 1950-2015(four connections) AIR Privy Council Data Base 1900-1950 (four connections) AIR Mannual latest 6th Edition(1-45 Vols.) AIR Journal 2015, Cr. L.J. 2015, L.I.C. 2015, AIR Civil Cases 2015, AIR Law Lines 2015, AIR Cheque Dishonour Reports 2015, AIR Accident Claims and compensation 2015, Institution shall get electronic versions updated every year by AIR Pvt. Ltd. Central Acts and Local Acts, Criminal law journal, SCC, Company cases, Indian Bar Review, selected Judgements on Professional Ethics and Journals with the back volumes for at least ten years and also such number of text books in each subjects taught during the period according to the minimum standard ratio of ten books for each registered students. For running integrated program, text books of such other subjects are also to be kept in the similar minimum ratio.
5. The **Centre of Legal Education** should keep in mind that minimum 10 sets of Indian Bar Review, selected judgments and professional Ethics published by Bar Council of India Trust and the AIR volumes/set must be promptly ordered for the library if not already ordered, as it is an essential requirement to run a law college which is stipulated by Bar Council of India, Legal Education Rules 2008 framed under a Parliament Act.
6. The **Center of Legal Education** is directed to make a minimum investment as provided below for upgrading it's library as per the following guideline :-
"Today with the increasing cost of journals, books, wi-fi, e-library and online facilities including I.T. facilities, the minimum investment by each university should be Rs. 10 lakhs for each year. However for any university/deemed university in rural area, the investment should be Rs. 5 Lakh and for all other affiliated colleges in the urban area it should be Rs. 2 lakhs and in rural area it should be Rs. 1 lakh."
7. Teacher Student ratio **shall be 1:40** as per Schedule-III, Rule-11, Clause-17, Part-IV of Bar Council of India Rules.
8. **Centre of Legal Education** is directed to inform the timings of the classes.
9. **Centre of Legal Education** must ensure that not less than three percent seats are reserved for persons with disabilities.
10. **Centre of Legal Education** shall equip itself to provide appropriate facilities in terms of the physical infrastructure, academic infrastructure and any other facilities required for the effective participation of disabled students, teachers and staff in their respective activities. For e.g. (a) ramps in public buildings and (b) Braille symbols and auditory signals in elevators or lifts.

- C. Further, the Centre of Legal Education should maintain the timing which has to be minimum 5 ½ hours with half an hour break.

Rule (xxiii), Chapter I

“(xxiii) “Regular Course of Study” means and includes a course which runs for at least five hours a day continuously with an additional half an hour recess every day and running not less than thirty hours of working schedule per week.”

Rule 5 of Schedule III

“Classes may be conducted between 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. in a Centre of Legal Education, which is not fully residential. However the Library may remain open till 10 p.m.”

- D. Further, the Centre of Legal Education should follow the attendance rule and file affidavit that they are following the aforesaid and below mentioned rule. The next inspection team shall also see whether the said rules are being followed by the university or not. The relevant Rule 12 is given below :-

“12. End Semester Test: No student of any of the degree program shall be allowed to take the end semester test in a subject if the student concerned has not attended minimum of 70% of the classes held in the subject concerned as also the moot court room exercises, tutorials and practical training conducted in the subject taken together.

Provided that if a student for any exceptional reasons fail to attend 70% of the classes held in any subject, the Dean of the University or the Principal of the Centre of Legal Education, as the case may be, may allow the student to take the test if the student concerned attended at least 65% of the classes held in the subject concerned and attended 70% of classes in all the subjects taken together. The similar power shall rest with the Vice Chancellor or Director of a National Law University, or his authorized representative in the absence of the Dean of Law.

Provided further that a list of such students allowed to take the test with reasons recorded be forwarded to the Bar Council of India.”

- E. Centre of Legal Education should also admit students as per the below mentioned Rule:

7. Minimum marks in qualifying examination for admission: Bar Council of India may from time to time, stipulate the minimum percentage of marks not below 45% of the total marks in case of general category applicants, 42% for OBC category and 40% of the total marks in case of SC and ST applicants, to be obtained for the qualifying examination, such as +2 Examination in case of Integrated Five Years' course or Degree course in any discipline for Three years' LL.B. course, for the purpose of applying for and getting admitted into a Law Degree Program of any recognized University in either of the streams.

Provided that such a minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a person to get admission into an institution but only shall entitle the person concerned to fulfill other institutional criteria notified by the institution concerned or by the government concerned from time to time to apply for admission.

F. Centre of Legal Education to follow Clause-24, Schedule-II of Legal Education Rule-2008 lays down Moot Court exercises and Internship; Clause-25, Schedule-III lays down Minimum period of Internship which is quoted hereunder.

(i) 24. Moot court exercise and Internship:

This paper may have three components of 30 marks each and a viva for 10 marks.

(a) Moot Court (30 Marks). Every student may be required to do at least three moot courts in a year with 10 marks for each. The moot court work will be on assigned problem and it will be evaluated for 5 marks for written submissions and 5 marks for oral advocacy.

(b) Observance of Trial in two cases, one Civil and one Criminal (30 marks):

Students may be required to attend two trials in the course of the last two or three years of LL.B. studies. They will maintain a record and enter the various steps observed during their attendance on different days in the court assignment. This scheme will carry 30 marks.

(c) Interviewing techniques and Pre-trial preparations and Internship diary (30 marks):

Each student will observe two interviewing sessions of clients at the Lawyer's Office/Legal Aid Office and record the proceedings in a diary, which will carry 15 marks. Each student will further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the Advocate and the procedure for the filing of the suit/petition. This will be recorded in the diary, which will carry 15 marks.

(d)The fourth component of this paper will be Viva Voce examination on all the above three aspects. This will carry 10 marks.

(ii) 25. Minimum Period of Internship: **(a)** Each registered student shall have completed minimum of twelve weeks internship for Three Year Course stream and twenty weeks in case of Five Year Course stream during the entire period of legal studies under NGO, Trial and Appellate Advocates, Judiciary, Legal Regulatory authorities, Legislatures and Parliament, Other Legal Functionaries, Market Institutions, Law Firms, Companies, Local Self Government and other such bodies as the University shall stipulate, where law is practiced either in action or in dispute resolution or in management.

Provided that internship in any year cannot be for a continuous period of more than Four Weeks and all students shall at least gone through once in the entire academic period with Trial and Appellate Advocates.

(b) Each student shall keep Internship diary in such form as may be stipulated by the University concerned and the same shall be evaluated by the Guide in Internship and also a Core Faculty member of the staff each time. The total mark shall be assessed in the Final Semester of the course in the 4th Clinical course as stipulated under the Rules in Schedule II.

- G. Centre of Legal Education should also follow Rule- 10 of Legal Education Rules 2008 which is quoted hereunder :-**

10. Semester system

The course leading to either degree in law, unitary or on integrated double degree, shall be conducted in semester system in not less than 15 weeks for unitary degree course or not less than 18 weeks in double degree integrated course with not less than 30 class-hours per week including tutorials, moot court room exercise and seminars provided there shall be at least 24 lecture hours per week.

Provided further that in case of specialized and/or honours law courses there shall be not less than 36 class-hours per week including seminar, moot court and tutorial classes and 30 minimum lecture hours per week.

Provided further that Universities are free to adopt trimester system with appropriate division of courses per trimester with each of the trimester not less than 12 weeks.

- H. Centre of Legal Education should also follow Rule 17 and Rule 18 of Schedule III of Legal Education Rules 2008 which is quoted hereunder :-**

(i) Rule 17. Core Faculty:

There shall be sufficient number of full time faculty members in each Centre of Legal Education (i.e. ,Department, constituent or affiliated college) to teach each subject at all point of time for running courses who can be supported by part time or visiting faculty. Such a core faculty shall in no case be less than six in the first year of the approval with both streams in operation, eight in the second year and ten in the case of third year of law courses. In addition, for the integrated course qualification as is required under the UGC guideline or under such other standard setting body as the discipline is allotted to by any Act, statute, or Rules of the Government of India or of a State.

For the Three Year Bachelor of Law degree course only with two sections without the Honour program, there shall be minimum of 4 core faculty in the first year six in the second and eight in the third year in addition to the Principal/Head or Dean as the case may be.

Provided that an institution intending to run any specialized or honours course must have at least three faculty in the group in which specialization and honours courses are offered.

Provided further that each full time faculty shall take as many classes in the subject or subjects as may be assigned to them on the basis of standard prescribed by 'the standard setting institution' like UGC.

Provided further, if any institution of a University, which was already affiliated to the University and approved to run professional courses of either scheme or both by the Bar Council of India after inspection of the University, falls short of required full time faculty, the new admission in courses may be required to remain suspended until new required number of faculty is procured. The University shall before starting a new academic session, notify which institutions are only be allowed to admit fresh students.

Provided further that if while inspecting the University it was found that in any institution of the University adequate number of full time faculty was not there in the staff, the Bar Council after giving notice to the University

might give a public notice directing the University not to admit students in the new academic year in that institution.

There shall be adequate faculty in the subjects offered in the liberal educational subjects as part of the course by the institution. These faculties in the liberal educational discipline in Arts, Science, Management, Commerce, Engineering, Technology or any other discipline shall possess

(ii) Rule -18 Minimum weekly class program per subject (paper):.

There shall be for each paper (with 4 credit) Four class-hours for one hour duration each and one hour of tutorial/moot court/project work per week.

AFFIDAVIT-

- ✓ **Kindly ensure to comply with all the above stipulated and all other requisite Rules of Legal Education 2008 by way of duly notarized compliance affidavit by attaching adequate documentation proof with the same with a period of 6 weeks for being eligible to be issued further Approval for further subsequent academic years and failure to furnish the same shall make the CLE liable to the natural consequences which may include revocation of recognition/approval granted.**



- 4.35 "teacher" means professors, associate professors, assistant professors and such other academic staff as may be appointed for imparting instructions or conducting research in the institution deemed to be University including the adjunct faculty or professor of practice or visiting faculty; and
- 4.36 the words and expressions used in these regulations and not defined, but defined in the Act shall have the same meanings respectively assigned to them.

5. Objectives of the Institution Deemed to be University

The objectives of the Nehru Gram Bharati (Deemed to be University) shall be to-

- 5.1 provide for higher education leading to excellence and innovations in such branches of knowledge as may be deemed fit, primarily at undergraduate, post-graduate, and research degree levels, fully conforming to the concept of a University;
- 5.2 engage in inter-disciplinary or multi-disciplinary or trans-disciplinary teaching and research in addition to domain-specific specialisation;
- 5.3 provide for high-quality teaching and research recognised nationally and globally;
- 5.4 recognise, identify and foster the unique capabilities of each student, by sensitising teachers as well as parents to promote each student's holistic development;
- 5.5 provide multi-disciplinary and a holistic education in the faculties of science, engineering, technology, social sciences, arts, humanities, sports and other disciplines;
- 5.6 transform into research and teaching intensive University over a period of time;
- 5.7 focus on research and innovation by setting up start-up incubation centers; technology development centres; centres in frontier areas of research; greater industry-academic linkages; and inter-disciplinary research including humanities and social sciences research;
- 5.8 provide flexible and innovative curriculum, which includes credit-based courses and projects in the areas of community engagement and service, environmental education, value-based education, etc.;
- 5.9 contribute for social transformation through socially responsive teaching, learning, research, and fieldwork;
- 5.10 adopt the provisions of NEP, 2020; and
- 5.11 strengthen the research ecosystem by establishing a Research and Development Cell (RDC);
- 5.12 possess such academic and physical infrastructure as may be specified by the Commission or the relevant statutory body, as the case may be;
- 5.13 have teacher-student ratio of 1:20 with a minimum combined faculty strength of not less than one hundred and fifty teachers and a minimum combined student strength of three thousand on rolls under the regular classroom mode, of which not less than one fifth being post-graduate or research or as per the norms of the relevant statutory body; and
- 5.14 shall have an administrative area, library, lecture halls, labs, hostels, health care, common facilities and recreational facilities.

6. Powers and Functions

To carry out the above objectives and for management and properties of the Nehru Gram Bharati (Deemed to be University), the Institute shall have the following powers :

- 6.1 To establish courses of study and research and to provide instruction in such branches of study as the institute deems appropriate for advancement of learning and dissemination of knowledge in such branches.
- 6.2 To confer degrees and to grant diplomas and or Certificates to persons who have satisfactorily completed the approved course of study and/or research as may be prescribed and shall have passed the prescribed examinations.
- 6.3 No benefaction that involves conditions and obligations opposed to the spirit and objectives of the Institution shall be accepted by the Institute.
- 6.4 To institute and award visitor ship, fellowship exhibits, prizes & medals and prescription of the conditions thereof.

7. Corpus Fund

- 7.1 A corpus fund of rupees twenty lakh or as decided by the Commission from time to time, shall be maintained in the name of the institution deemed to be University.
- 7.2 The interest accrued on the corpus fund shall be used only for the purpose of further development of the institution deemed to be University; and
- 7.3 Institutions deemed to be University shall invest the corpus fund in any suitable scheme or schemes.



8. Off-Campus Centres and Off-Shore campuses:

8.1 Off-campus centres—

- 8.1.1 (i) Institutions deemed to be Universities with minimum 'A' grade and above or ranked from 1 to 100 in the "Universities" category of NIRF rankings of the relevant year are eligible to set up off-campus centres.
- 8.1.2 (ii) Institutions declared as deemed to be Universities under "distinct category" may apply for off campuses after five years of their declaration, if they fulfill the criteria specified in clause (i).

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- 8.1.3 The Institution Deemed to be University shall have the proposed off-campus centres in accordance with the norms and standards specified by the relevant statutory body or the Commission, as the case may be, and the Institute shall start the off-campus centre with a minimum of five undergraduate or post-graduate or research or combination thereof with a minimum of one thousand students, of which not less than one-fifth of the students shall

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be post-graduate or research students with fifty teachers and with required infrastructure facilities.

- 8.1.4 The Government may withdraw the approval granted for starting the off-campus centre if at any time, it is found that the information provided by the institution deemed to be University is incorrect and in order to protect the interests of students enrolled at such centre, the institution deemed to be University shall take necessary action for shifting of such students to the main campus.
- 8.1.5 The institution deemed to be University shall start new courses or programmes in any field in their existing campus and approved off-campus centres only with the prior approval of its Executive Council and also, wherever applicable, with the approval of the relevant statutory bodies:

8.2 Off-Shore Campus

- 8.2.1 Nehru Gram Bharati (Deemed to be University) will establish off-shore campuses with the prior approval of the Central Government in accordance with the provisions of the Act, rules and regulations made thereunder.
- 8.2.2 Existing off-shore campuses shall continue to operate, provided they have obtained proper permissions and approval.

9. Monitoring the Performance of the Deemed to be University:

- 9.1 The Commission shall monitor the performance and academic outcomes of the institutions deemed to be University.
- 9.2 The Commission shall decide on the physical verification of an institution deemed to be University or constitute a committee for verification on its own or upon receipt of any complaint regarding accuracy and veracity of the information submitted to the Commission and also hosted on the website of the institution.



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10. Governance

- 10.1 (1) The Institution deemed to be University shall be registered as a not-for-profit society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (21 of 1860) or as a not-for-profit trust under the Indian Trusts Act, 1882 (2 of 1882) or as a not-for-profit company registered under section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013 (18 of 2013):
- 10.2 PROVIDED that a sponsoring body exclusively established for running educational institutions shall be exempted from registering as a separate not-for-profit society or trust or a company and the sponsoring body shall specifically mention in its registration deed that the sponsoring body is

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exclusively for running educational activities and no other activities are being carried out or shall be carried out in the future under it:

PROVIDED further that if the sponsoring body of an existing institution deemed to be University does not have a society or trust or company exclusively for running educational institutions, it shall form a new not-for-profit society or trust or company, for the purposes of institution deemed to be University and in such cases, the sponsoring body shall be exempted from transferring its moveable and immovable assets to the newly created society or trust or company, if such sponsoring body provides a notarised affidavit to the effect that the entire moveable and immovable assets allocated to the institution deemed to be University shall not be leased or otherwise disposed of without the prior permission of the Commission:

PROVIDED also that the sponsoring body shall make available the necessary infrastructure for operating the institution deemed to be University without any rental or other such charges.

- 10.3 All moveable and immovable assets of the institution deemed to be University shall be used for the purposes of conducting academic activities, promotion of research and related administrative requirements of the institution deemed to be University, including the outreach educational activities.
- 10.4 The highest governing body of the institution deemed to be University shall be the Executive Council to be headed by the Vice-Chancellor and consisting of not less than ten and not more than thirteen members.
- 10.5 The Executive Council shall be the principal governing body of the institution deemed to be University

11. The composition of the Executive Council shall be as under -

- (a) Vice-Chancellor - Chairperson;
- (b) Pro-Vice-Chancellor (wherever applicable);
- (c) two members from amongst the Deans of schools of studies, by rotation, to be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor;
- (d) one Professor, who is not a Dean, by rotation, to be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor;
- (e) one Associate Professor, by rotation, to be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor;
- (f) one Assistant Professor, by rotation, to be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor;
- (g) One representative shall be nominated by the Commission;
- (h) up to four nominees of the Sponsoring body; and
- (i) the Registrar, who shall be the *ex-officio* Secretary of the Executive Council.

12. Tenure of the members of Executive Council —

12.1 All the members of the Executive Council, other than the Vice-Chancellor and Pro-Vice-Chancellor, shall hold office for a term of three years and in the case of Deans, the term shall be three years or until they hold the office of Dean, whichever is earlier.

12.2 Members of the Executive Council appointed by the Vice-Chancellor from Professor, Associate Professor and Assistant Professor category shall hold office for a period of one year or till such time they cease to be teachers of the University, whichever is earlier.

13. Powers and Limitations of the executive Council

13.1 The Executive Council shall have the power of management and administration of the institution deemed to be University.

13.2 The Executive Council shall be the final decision-making body of the institution deemed to be University in respect of every matter of the institution deemed to be University, including academic, administrative, personnel, financial, and developmental matters.

13.3 Subject to the provisions of these regulations and the rules of the institution deemed to be University, the Executive Council shall, in addition to all other powers vested in it, have the following powers,

- a) to appoint such Professors, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors and other academic staff, including Chairs, as may be recommended by the Selection Committee constituted for the said purposes and to fill up temporary vacancies therein;
- b) to regulate and enforce discipline amongst the students of the institution in accordance with the rules of the institution deemed to be University;
- c) to provide for the appointment of Visiting Professors, Emeritus Professors, Professor of Practice, Consultants, Scholars, etc., and determine the terms and conditions of such appointments;
- d) to exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be conferred or imposed on it by the rules and regulations of the institution deemed to be University;
- e) to make rules and regulations for the institution deemed to be University; and

14. Meeting of the Executive Council

- 14.1 The Executive Council shall meet at least four times a year (twice in one semester), with not less than seven days' prior notice given before every meeting of the Executive Council and emergency meetings may be convened at a shorter notice, for reasons to be recorded in writing for such emergency meeting.



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- 14.2 One-third of the total number of members of the Executive Council shall form the **quorum** for the meeting.
- 14.3 In the absence of the Vice-Chancellor, the Pro-Vice Chancellor shall **preside** over the meeting; and where there is no Pro-Vice-Chancellor in an institution deemed to be University, a member chosen by the other members of the Executive Council present at the meeting, shall preside over the meeting.
- 14.4 Every member of the Executive Council including the Chairperson, shall have one vote and the decisions at the meetings of the Executive Council shall be taken by simple majority; and in case of a tie, the Chairperson shall have a casting vote.
- 14.5 Any business, which may be urgent in nature, may be carried out by circulation amongst its members.
- 14.6 A copy of the minutes of each meeting shall be furnished to the Chancellor of the institution deemed to be University, as soon as possible after the **convening** of the meeting

15. Termination of Membership of the Executive Council:

If a member other than the Vice-Chancellor and those representing the teachers, accepts a full-time appointment in the institution deemed to be University or fails to attend three consecutive meetings of the Executive Council, without proper leave of absence, such member shall cease to be a member of the Executive Council.

16. Delegation of Powers of the Executive Council:

The Executive Council may, by a resolution, delegate to the Vice Chancellor or any other officer or faculty or to a Committee of officers or faculties of the institution deemed to be University, such powers as it may deem fit, subject to the condition that the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor or the officer or faculty or the Committee in the exercise of the powers so delegated, shall be reported at the next meeting of the Executive Council.



Other authorities of institution deemed to be University —

17. Composition of Academic Council :

The Academic Council shall be the principal academic body of the institution deemed to be University and shall, subject to the provision of the rules of the institution deemed to be University, co-ordinate and exercise general supervision over the academic policy of the institution deemed to be University.

(2) The composition of the Academic Council shall be as under—

- (i) Vice Chancellor - Chairperson;
- (ii) Pro Vice-Chancellor (wherever applicable);
- (iii) Deans of faculties of the schools and heads of the departments or certain Professors (excluding those who are Deans of schools and heads of

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- departments or centres) by rotation, to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor giving due regard to the representation of different schools or departments or centres;
- (iv) up to five Associate Professors from departments or centres other than the heads of the departments or centres, by rotation, to be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor;
- (v) up to five Assistant Professors from the departments or centres other than the heads of the departments or centres, by rotation, to be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor;
- (vi) six persons of repute from amongst the educationists or experts for their specialised knowledge, who are not in the service of the institution deemed to be University, nominated by the Vice Chancellor; and
- (vii) the Registrar, who shall be the *ex-officio* Secretary of the Academic Council.
- (3) The representation of different categories shall be through rotation and not through an election and the term of members, other than the *ex-officio* members, shall be three years and the Controller of Examination shall be the permanent invitee to the meetings of the Academic Council.

18. Powers and Functions of the Academic Council:

Subject to the provisions of these regulations and rules of the institution deemed to be University, the Academic Council shall, in addition to all other powers vested in it, have the following powers, namely:—

- (a) to exercise general supervision over the various activities of the institution deemed to be University and to give directions regarding methods of instruction, co-ordination of teaching among departments or faculties or schools or centers, evaluation of research and improvement of academic standards;
- (b) to bring about and promote inter-departmental, inter-school, inter-center co-ordination and to establish or constitute committees or boards, as may be deemed necessary for the purpose;
- (c) to consider matters of general academic interest either on its own initiative, or on a reference by a department or faculty or school or centre or the Executive Council, and to take appropriate action thereon;
- (d) to prescribe courses or programmes of study leading to degree and diploma of the institution deemed to be University;
- (e) to make arrangements for the conduct of examinations in conformity with the rules and bye-laws of the institution deemed to be University;
- (f) to maintain proper standards of the examination;
- (g) to recognise diplomas and degrees of Universities and other Institutions and to determine equivalence with the diplomas and degrees of the institution deemed to be University;
- (h) to institute Fellowships, Scholarships, Medals, Prizes, etc.;
- (i) to frame rules covering the academic functioning of the institution deemed to be University, admissions, examinations, award of fellowships and studentships, scholarships, concessions, attendance, discipline, residence, etc.;

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- (j) to take a periodical review of the activities of the departments or centres and to take appropriate action to maintain and improve the standards of instruction;
- (k) to recommend the institution of teaching posts (Professors, Associate Professors, and Assistant Professors) to the Executive Council;
- (l) to make recommendations to the Executive Council for the establishment or abolition of departments or centres or schools or faculties, etc.
- (m) to make recommendations to the Executive Council; and
- (n) to exercise such other powers and to perform such other duties, as may be conferred or imposed upon it by the rules of the institution deemed to be University.

19. Meeting of the Academic Council:

- 19.1 The Academic Council shall meet as often as necessary but not less than four times (at least two times in a semester) during an academic year with not less than seven days prior notice being given before every meeting of the Academic Council and emergency meetings may be convened at a shorter notice, for reasons to be recorded in writing for an emergency meeting.
- 19.2 One-third of the total number of members of the Academic Council shall constitute the quorum for the meetings of the Academic Council.
- 19.3 Each member, including its representative shall have one vote, and decisions at the meetings of the Academic Council shall be taken by simple majority; and in case of a tie, the Chairperson shall have a casting vote.
- 19.4 Any business that may be necessary for the Academic Council to perform, which may be urgent in nature, may be carried out by circulation amongst its members.



20. Composition of the Finance Committee:

20.1 The composition of the Finance Committee shall be—

- (i) Vice Chancellor - Chairperson;
- (ii) Pro Vice-Chancellor (wherever applicable);
- (iii) one person nominated by the society or trust or company, as the case may be (wherever applicable);
- (iv) three persons to be nominated by the Executive Council, out of whom at least one shall be a member of the Executive Council;
- (v) One representative shall be nominated by the Commission;
- (vi) three persons to be nominated by the Chancellor;
- (vii) Finance Officer-Secretary- ex officio

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20.2 All members of the Finance Committee other than ex-officio member shall hold office for a term of three years.

20.3 The Finance Committee shall meet at least four times in an academic year (at least twice each semester) to examine the accounts and scrutinise the proposals for

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expenditure and **one-third of the total number** of members of the Finance Committee shall form the **quorum** for a meeting.

20.4 All proposals relating to the creation of posts and those items which have not been included in the Budget, shall be examined by the Finance Committee before the Executive Council considers them and to decide waiver in fees, the establishment of scholarships, freeship and any other financial benefits.

20.5 The annual accounts and financial estimates of the institution deemed to be University prepared by the Finance Officer shall be laid before the Finance Committee for consideration and comments and thereafter the same shall be submitted to the Executive Council for approval.

20.6 The Finance Committee shall recommend limits for the total recurring and non-recurring expenditures for the year, based on the income and resources of the institution deemed to be University.

21. Board of Studies

21.1 There shall be one Board of Studies for each department or school of the institution deemed to be University. The composition of the Board of Studies shall be—

- (i) Dean of school or Head of the department;
- (ii) all Professors of the school or department;
- (iii) two Associate Professors of the school or department, by rotation;
- (iv) two Assistant Professors of the school or department, by rotation; and
- (v) two external experts to be co-opted for their specialised knowledge.

21.2 Subject to the overall control and supervision of the Academic Council, the functions of a Board of Studies shall be to approve subjects for research for various degrees and other requirements of research degrees and to recommend to the concerned School Board in such manner as may be prescribed by the rules of the institution deemed to be University regarding—

- (a) courses of studies;
- (b) appointment of supervisors for research; and
- (c) measures for the improvement of the standards of teaching and research.

21.3 The powers and functions of the Board of Studies shall be prescribed by the rules of the institution deemed to be University.

22. Selection Committee for appointment of teaching Staff:

There shall be one or more Selection Committees constituted, for making recommendations to the Executive Council for appointment to the post of Professors, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors and such other posts as may be prescribed,

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in accordance with the University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and other Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2018.

23. Disqualifications:

23.1 A person shall be disqualified for being chosen as, and for being, a member of any of the authorities, or being appointed as, and for being, an officer, of the institution deemed to be University if—

- (a) if he or she is of unsound mind; or
- (b) if he or she is an un-discharged insolvent; or
- (c) if he or she has been convicted by a court of law for an offense involving moral turpitude and sentenced in respect thereof to imprisonment for not less than six months; or
- (d) if he or she has not been appointed as per the provisions of these regulations.

23.2 If any question arises as to whether a person is or had been subjected to any of the disqualifications mentioned above, the question shall be referred to the Chancellor, and his or her decision shall be final and binding. No suit or other proceedings shall lie in any civil court against such decision.



24. Misc. matters related to different authorities:

24.1 If any question arises, as to whether a person, other than Government nominated or appointed, has been duly nominated or appointed as, or is, entitled to be a member of any authority or any committee of the institution deemed to be University, the matter shall be referred to the Chancellor, whose decision thereon shall be final and binding.

24.2 Any member, other than an ex-officio member of any authority, may resign by a letter addressed to the Registrar, and the resignation shall take effect as soon as it is accepted by the Chancellor or the Chairperson of the Executive Council, as the case may be.

24.3 Sudden vacancies among the members of any authority or any Committee of the institution deemed to be University shall be filled by the respective authority, as soon as may be, and within a period of six months.

Officers of the Institution Deemed to be University:

25. Chancellor:

25.1 The Chancellor shall hold office for a period of five years from the date of assuming office and shall be eligible for re-appointment for one more term by following the procedure prescribed for the appointment of the Chancellor:

PROVIDED that the Chancellor in the institutions deemed to be Universities shall be appointed by the sponsoring body.

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25.2 The Chancellor shall, by virtue of his or her office, be the head of the institution deemed to be University and shall, if present, preside at the Convocations of the institution deemed to be University held for conferring degrees.

26. Vice Chancellor

26.1 The Vice-Chancellor shall be a whole-time salaried officer of the institution deemed to be University and shall be appointed by the Chancellor from a panel of three names suggested by a Search-cum-Selection Committee.

26.2 The qualifications of the Vice-Chancellor shall be in accordance with the University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and other Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2018.

26.3 The procedure for composition of Search-cum-Selection-Committee (SCSC) for the selection of Vice Chancellor shall be as under—

- (i) a nominee of the Chancellor, who shall be a reputed academician as the Chairperson of the Committee;
- (ii) a nominee of the Chairperson of the University Grants Commission; and
- (iii) an academician, with not less than five years' service as Professor, nominated by the Executive Council.

26.4 The Vice-Chancellor shall hold office for a period of five years from the date on which he or she enters upon his or her office or she attains the age of seventy years, whichever is earlier and shall be eligible for re-appointment for one more term by following the procedure prescribed for the appointment of Vice-Chancellor:

Provided that notwithstanding the expiry of the said period of five years, he or she shall continue in office until his or her successor is appointed and enters upon his or her office, however, in no case, the Vice-Chancellor shall hold office beyond the age of seventy years:

Provided further that the Chancellor may direct the Vice-Chancellor, after his or her term has expired, to continue in office for such period, not exceeding a total period of one year.

26.5 If the office of the Vice-Chancellor becomes vacant due to death, resignation or otherwise, or if he or she is unable to perform his or her duties due to ill health or any other cause, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall perform the duties of the Vice-Chancellor:

Provided that if the Pro-Vice-Chancellor is unavailable, the Chancellor shall appoint the senior most Professor who shall perform the duties of the Vice-Chancellor, until a



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When Vice-Chancellor assumes office or the existing Vice-Chancellor resumes the duties of his or her office, as the case may be.

27. Power and duties of Vice Chancellor

27.1 The Vice-Chancellor shall be the Principal Executive Officer and academic officer of the institution deemed to be University and shall exercise general supervision and control over the affairs of the institution deemed to be University and give effect to the decision of all authorities of the institution deemed to be University.

27.2 The Vice-Chancellor may, if he or she is of the opinion that immediate action is necessary on any matter, exercise any power conferred on any authority of the institution deemed to be University by or under these regulations and shall report to such authority at its next meeting the action taken by him or her on such matter:

PROVIDED that, if the authority mentioned in this sub-regulation is of the opinion that such action ought not to have been taken, it may refer the matter to the Chancellor whose decision thereon shall be final:

PROVIDED further that any person aggrieved by the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor under this regulation shall have the right to represent his or her objection to the Executive Council within ninety days from the date on which the decision on which such action is communicated to him and thereupon the Executive Council may, in its discretion, modify or reverse the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor.



27.3 The Vice-Chancellor, if he or she is of the opinion that any decision of any authority of the institution deemed to be University is beyond the power of the authority conferred by the provisions of these regulations or that any decision taken is not in the interest of the institution deemed to be University, may ask the authority concerned to review its decision within sixty days of such decision and if the authority refuses to review the decision either in whole or in part or no decision is taken by it within the said period of sixty days, the matter shall be referred to the Chancellor whose decision thereon shall be final.

27.4 The Vice-Chancellor shall be the ex-officio Chairperson of the Executive Council, the Academic Council and the Finance Committee and shall, in the absence of the Chancellor, preside at the Convocations held for conferring degrees to the students.

27.5 The Vice-Chancellor shall be entitled to be present at, and address, any meeting of any authority or other body of the institution deemed to be University, but shall not be entitled to vote unless he or she is a member of such authority or body.

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27.6 It shall be the duty of the Vice-Chancellor to see that these regulations are duly observed and implemented and he or she shall have all the powers necessary to ensure such implementation.

27.7 The Vice-Chancellor shall have all the powers necessary for the proper maintenance of discipline in the institution deemed to be University, and he or she may delegate any such powers to such person or persons, as he or she may deem fit.

27.8 The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to convene or cause to be convened the meetings of the Executive Council, the Academic Council, the Finance Committee, and other authorities.

28. Removal of the Vice Chancellor

28.1 Where there are reasons to believe that the Vice-Chancellor of an institution deemed to be University does not possess the qualifications as required under the University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and other Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2018, or is not appointed as per the procedure stipulated in these regulations or has committed any financial or administrative impropriety, the Chairman of the Commission shall constitute an enquiry committee consisting of academic, administrative and financial experts to enquire into the matter.

28.2 On the directions from the Commission, the Chancellor shall place the Vice-Chancellor under suspension, pending an enquiry.

28.3 The enquiry committee shall give an opportunity of hearing to the Vice-Chancellor before submitting its report to the Commission and where the report of the enquiry committee confirms the ineligibility or procedural violations or impropriety, as the case may be, the Commission shall direct the Chancellor to remove the Vice Chancellor by following due procedure:

28.4 Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, the Chancellor may, at any time after the Vice Chancellor has entered upon his or her office, by order in writing, remove the Vice-Chancellor from office on the grounds of incapacity, misconduct or violation of these regulations:

PROVIDED that the Chancellor shall make no such order unless the Vice-Chancellor has been given a reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the action proposed to be taken against him:

PROVIDED further that the Chancellor may, at any time before making such order, place the Vice-Chancellor under suspension, pending an inquiry.

29. Pro Vice-Chancellor :

29.1 On the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor, the Executive Council shall appoint a Professor as Pro-Vice-Chancellor to discharge the duties of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor in addition to his or her duties as a Professor:

PROVIDED further that where the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor is not accepted by the Executive Council, the matter shall be referred to the Chancellor, who may either appoint the Professor recommended by the Vice-Chancellor or ask the Vice-Chancellor to recommend name of another Professor for re-consideration by the Executive Council.

29.2 The term of office of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall be such as may be decided by the Executive Council, but it shall not, in any case, exceed five years or until the expiration of the term of office of the Vice-Chancellor, whichever is earlier:

PROVIDED that the Pro-Vice-Chancellor whose term of office has expired shall be eligible for re-appointment by following the procedure prescribed for the appointment of Pro-Vice-Chancellor:

PROVIDED further that the Pro-Vice-Chancellor while discharging the duties of the Vice-Chancellor, continue in office until the expiration of his or her term of office as Pro-Vice-Chancellor, or until the Vice-Chancellor resumes office or a new Vice-Chancellor assumes office, as the case may be:

PROVIDED also that, in any case, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall retire on attaining the age of sixty-five years.

29.3 The Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall have the powers and duties as may be prescribed by the rules of the institution deemed to be University.

29.4 The Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall assist the Vice-Chancellor in respect of such matters as may be specified by the Vice-Chancellor on this behalf, from time to time, and shall also exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be assigned or delegated to him by the Vice-Chancellor.

30. Registrar

30.1 (a) The Registrar shall be a whole-time salaried officer of the institution deemed to be University and shall be appointed by the Executive Council on the recommendations of the selection committee consisting of the following:—

- (i) Vice-Chancellor - Chairperson;
- (ii) one nominee of the Chancellor;

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- (iii) two members of the Executive Council nominated by it; and
(iv) one expert not in the service of the University to be nominated by the Executive Council.

(b) The meeting of the selection committee shall be fixed after prior consultation with, and subject to the convenience of the Chancellor's nominee and the experts-nominated by the Executive Council and the proceedings of the selection committee shall not be valid unless at least three of the Chancellor's nominees or persons nominated by the Executive Council attended the meeting.

30.2 The Registrar shall hold office for a term of five years from the date of assuming office and shall be eligible for re-appointment for a second term by following the procedure prescribed for Registrar:

PROVIDED that, the Registrar shall retire on attaining the age of sixty-two years and the emoluments and other terms and conditions of service of the Registrar shall be such as may be prescribed by the rules of the institution deemed to be University.

30.3 When the office of the Registrar is, by reason of illness, absence, or any other cause, unable to perform the duties of his or her office, the duties of the office shall be performed by such person as the Vice-Chancellor may appoint for the purpose.

30.4 The Registrar shall be ex-officio a member of the Executive Council and the Academic Council, but shall not be deemed a member of any of these authorities.

30.5 The Registrar shall be directly responsible to the Vice-Chancellor and work under his or her direction.

30.6 The Registrar shall have the power to take disciplinary action against employees, excluding teachers and other academic staff, as may be specified in the order of the Executive Council and to suspend them pending inquiry, to administer warnings to them or to impose on them the penalty of censure or the withholding of increment:

PROVIDED that no such penalty shall be imposed unless the person has been given a reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the action proposed to be taken in regard to him or her.

30.7 An appeal shall lie to the Vice-Chancellor against any order of the Registrar imposing any of the penalties specified in sub-regulation (30.6).

30.8 In the case where the inquiry discloses that a punishment beyond the power of the Registrar is called for, the Registrar shall, upon the conclusion of the inquiry, make a report to the Vice-Chancellor along with his or her recommendations:

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PROVIDED that an appeal shall lie to the Executive Council against an order of the Vice-Chancellor imposing any penalty.

30.9 It shall be the duty of the Registrar—

(a) to be the custodian of the records, the common seal, and such other property of the institution deemed to be University as the Executive Council shall commit to his or her charge;

(b) to issue all notices convening meetings of the Executive Council, the Academic Council, and any Committees appointed by those authorities;

(c) to keep the minutes of all the meetings of the Executive Council, the Academic Council, and any Committees appointed by those authorities;

(d) to conduct the official correspondence between the Executive Council and the Academic Council;

(e) to supply to the Chancellor copies of the agenda of the meetings of the authorities of the institution deemed to be University as soon as they are issued and the minutes of such meetings;

(f) to represent the institution deemed to be University in suits or proceedings by or against the

University, sign powers of attorney, pleadings or depute his or her representative for the purpose;

(g) to perform such other duties as may be specified in the rules of the institution deemed to be

University or as may be required from the Registrar by the Executive Council or the Vice-Chancellor, as the case may be;

(h) to enter into an agreement, sign documents, and authenticate records on behalf of the institution deemed to be University;

(i) to make arrangements to safeguard and maintain the buildings, gardens, office, canteen, cars and other vehicles, laboratories, libraries, reading rooms, equipment and other properties of the institution deemed to be University; and (j) to conduct the official correspondence on behalf of the authorities of the institution deemed to be University.

31. Finance Officer:

31.1 The Finance Officer shall be appointed by the Executive Council on the recommendations of a selection committee constituted for the purpose and he or she shall be a whole-time salaried officer of the institution deemed to be University.

31.2 The Finance Officer shall be appointed for a term of five years and shall be eligible for re-appointment by following the procedure prescribed for the appointment of the Finance Officer:

Provided that, the Finance Officer shall retire on attaining the age of sixty-two years.

31.3 The emoluments and other terms and conditions of service of the Finance Officer shall be such as may be prescribed by the Executive Council from time to time.



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31.4 When the office of the Finance Officer is vacant or when the Finance Officer is, by reason of illness, absence or any other cause, unable to perform the duties of his or her office, the duties of the office shall be performed by such person as the Vice-Chancellor may appoint for the purpose.

31.5 The Finance Officer shall be ex-officio Secretary of the Finance Committee but shall not be deemed to be a member of such Committee.

31.6 The Finance Officer shall—

- (a) exercise general supervision over the funds of the institution deemed to be University and shall advise it as regards its financial policy; and
- (b) perform such other financial functions as may be assigned to him by the Executive Council or as may be prescribed by the rules of the institution deemed to be University.

31.7 Subject to the control of the Executive Council, the Finance Officer shall—

- (a) ensure that the limits fixed by the Executive Council for recurring and non-recurring expenditures for a year are not exceeded and that all amounts of money are expended on the purpose for which they are granted or allotted;
- (b) be responsible for the preparation of financial accounts and the budget of the institution deemed to be university and their presentation to the Executive Council;
- (c) keep a constant watch on the state of the cash and bank balances and on the state of investments;
- (d) watch the progress of the collection of revenues and give advice on the methods of collection employed;
- (e) ensure that the registers of buildings, land, stocks, and equipment are maintained and up-to-date and that stock-checking is conducted, of equipment and other consumable materials in all offices, departments, schools, faculties, centers and specialised laboratories;
- (f) bring to the notice of the Vice-Chancellor un-authorized expenditure and other financial irregularities and suggest disciplinary action against persons at fault;
- (g) call for from any office, department, school, faculty, centre, laboratory, etc. maintained by the institution deemed to be University any information or returns that he or she may consider necessary for the performance of his or her duties; and
- (h) work under the direction of the Vice-Chancellor and shall be responsible to the Executive Council through the Vice-Chancellor.



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32. Controller of Examination

32.1 The Controller of Examinations shall be appointed by the Executive Council on the recommendations of a selection committee constituted for the purpose and he or she shall be a whole-time salaried officer of the institution deemed to be University.

32.2 The Controller of Examinations shall be appointed for a term of five years and shall be eligible for reappointment by following the procedure prescribed for the appointment of Controller of Examination:

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Provided that the Controller of Examinations shall retire on attaining the age of sixty-two years.

32.3 The emoluments and other terms and conditions of service of the Controller of Examination shall be such as may be prescribed by the Executive Council from time to time.

32.4 When the office of the Controller of Examinations is vacant or when the Controller of Examinations is, by reason of illness, absence or any other cause, unable to perform the duties of his or her office, the duties of the office shall be performed by such person as the Vice-Chancellor may appoint for the purpose.

32.5 The Controller of Examination shall arrange for and superintend the examinations of the institution deemed to be University in the manner as may be prescribed by the rules of the institution deemed to be University.

32.6 The Controller of Examinations shall be a permanent invitee to the Academic Council.

32.7 The Controller of Examination shall ensure that all the specific directions of the Executive Council, Academic Council and Vice-Chancellor in respect of examination and evaluation are complied with.



33. Dean:

33.1 The Departments dealing with allied subjects may be grouped into faculties or schools, etc., and every faculty shall be headed by a Dean.

33.2 Every Dean of the school or faculty shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor from amongst the Professors in the school or faculty, by rotation, for a period of two years:

PROVIDED that if there is only one Professor or no Professor in a school or faculty, the Dean shall be appointed, for the time being, from amongst the Professor, if any, and the Associate Professors in the school or faculty.

33.3 When the office of the Dean is vacant or when the Dean is, by reason of illness, absence or any other cause, unable to perform duties of his or her office, the duties of the office shall be performed by the senior-most Professor or Associate Professor, as the case may be, in the School.

33.4 The Dean shall be the Head of the school or faculty or centre and shall be responsible for the conduct and maintenance of the standards of teaching and research in the school or faculty or centre and shall have such other functions as may be prescribed by the rules of the institution deemed to be University.

33.5 The Dean shall have the right to present and speak at any meeting of the Board of Studies or Committees of the school or faculty or centre, as the case may be, but shall not have the right to vote there unless he is a member thereof.

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34. Head of the Department:

34.1 There shall be a Head of the Department or chairperson of the centre for each of the department or centre in the institution deemed to be University, who shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor from amongst the Professors of the department or centre:

PROVIDED that if there is no Professor in the department or centre or there is only one Professor in the department or centre, whose term as Head of the department or chairperson of the centre is ending, the Vice Chancellor may appoint an Associate Professor as Head of the Department.

34.2 The term of the Head of the department or chairperson of the centre shall normally be two years and he or she shall be eligible for re-appointment for one more term by following the procedure prescribed for appointment of the Head of the department or chairperson of the centre.

34.3 The powers and functions of the Head of the department or chairperson of the centre shall be prescribed by the rules deemed to be University.

35. Admissions:

Admission of students to the institution deemed to be University shall be strictly based on merit in the entrance exam conducted by the Government Testing Agency or the institution deemed to be University and as prescribed by the appropriate statutory authority, wherever applicable and in case of no entrance examination, the admission of students to the institution deemed to be University may be made in the manner specified in the prospectus.

36. Fee Structure:

36.1 Donation or capitation fee in whatever nomenclature or form, either directly or indirectly, is strictly prohibited.

36.2 The institutions deemed to be University shall follow the rules and regulations regarding fee structure, number of seats, etc., issued by the relevant statutory bodies and in case an institution deemed to be University offers different courses which come under the regulatory ambit of different statutory bodies, namely the University Grants Commission, the All India Council of Technical Education, National Medical Council etc., the rules and regulations regarding fee structure, number of seats, etc., issued by such statutory body concerned shall be applicable.

36.3 The fee shall be fixed transparently, keeping in view non-profiteering or non-commercial aspects.

36.4 The fee shall be collected as declared in the prospectus of the institution deemed to be University and with a proper receipt for such payment and the prospectus also state that donation or capitation fee in whatever nomenclature or form, **सहायक रजिस्ट्रार**
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directly or indirectly, shall not be collected from the student or parent and in case of any grievance, the student or parent may submit their complaint to the institution deemed to be University.

36.5 The institution deemed to be University may provide fee concession or scholarships or may allocate some seats to meritorious students belonging to socially and economically deprived groups of the society.

36.6 The institution deemed to be University shall abide by all the University Grant Commission notifications, guidelines regarding the refund of fees and return of original certificates, as may be issued from time to time.

36.7 The institution deemed to be University shall maintain the records of the entire process of selection of candidates, exhibit such records on its website, and preserve such records for a minimum period of five years.

36.8 The institution deemed to be University shall make available the prospectus on its website at least sixty days before the commencement of admissions, including fee structure, refund policy, number of seats in a programme, eligibility qualifications, admission process, etc.

36.9 The institution deemed to be University shall not retain any original certificates of the students, faculty members, and staff.



37. Institution Deemed to be University Open to all

37.1 The institution deemed to be University shall be open to the persons of all genders and of whatever caste, creed, race or class, and it shall not be lawful for the institution deemed to be University to adopt or impose on any person, any test whatsoever of religious belief or profession in order to entitle him or her to be appointed as a faculty member of the institution deemed to be University or to hold any other office therein or to be admitted as a student in the institution deemed to be University or to graduate there at or to enjoy or exercise any privilege thereof:

PROVIDED that nothing in this section shall be deemed to prevent the institution deemed to be University from making special provision for the employment or admission of women, persons with disabilities, or of persons belonging to the weaker section of the society and, in particular, of the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the other socially and educationally backward classes of citizens.

37.2 All policies and procedures, in matters of admission, fee, and employment as applicable to the university level public funded and self-financing institutions, respectively, shall apply.

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38. Institution Deemed to be University to be Unitary

The institution deemed to be University shall be unitary in nature and shall not affiliate any other institution.

39. Reservations Policy:

Institution deemed to be University shall implement the policy on reservations in admissions and recruitment, in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution of India and any Act of Parliament for the time being in force and disclose all such information on its website.

40. Online or Distance Education

Institutions deemed to be Universities may offer courses online or distance courses or degrees in accordance with the regulations notified by the Commission from time to time.

41. Power to conduct enquiry and Consequences for violations of Regulations:

41.1 Where the Government or the Commission, as the case may be, receives information by way of a complaint that an institution deemed to be University has violated any of the provisions of these regulations, it shall cause to conduct an enquiry into the facts of such information after issuing a notice to the said effect to the institution deemed to be University.

41.2 The Commission may also cause an inspection, to be made by experts in matters of academics, administration, and finance regarding academic outcomes or any matter connected with the administration or finances of the institution deemed to be University for the purpose of the enquiry.

41.3 Based on the enquiry or through procedures mentioned in these regulations, if the Government or the Commission, as the case may be, is satisfied that the regulations have been violated, the institution deemed to be University shall be subjected to such action as provided in the University Grants Commission (Institutions deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2023.

42. Funds, Accounts, Audit and Annual Report

42.1 The books of accounts of the institution deemed to be University shall be maintained, managed, and operated in the name of the institution deemed to be University and not in the name of the sponsoring body or any other body; and, shall be



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kept in such form as may be specified by the Executive Council and conform to the rules or regulations, if any, prescribed by the Commission, in this regard.

42.2 Funds shall not be diverted at any time from the accounts of the institution deemed to be University to any other accounts, including to the accounts of the sponsoring body or to any other body.

42.3 The institution deemed to be University shall get its books of accounts audited annually, separately published and uploaded on the website of the institution and the accounts of institution deemed to be University shall also, where required, be open for inspection by the Commission.

42.4 The annual financial statements and accounts shall be audited by a qualified professional, a Member or Fellow of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, to be appointed by the institution deemed to be University:

PROVIDED that, the Commission may, on receipt of information regarding financial impropriety or embezzlement or illegal diversion of funds from the accounts of the institution deemed to be University; or on receipt of a complaint against the provisions of these regulations, issue a notice directing the institution deemed to be University to show cause as to why an inspection, including a forensic audit, not be ordered in respect of the complaint, and after providing a reasonable opportunity to the respondent institution, the Commission may on being satisfied that there were sufficient grounds to proceed further, cause an inspection by a member of the Commission or may direct a forensic audit; the report of and the inspection team and the forensic audit report taken together shall form the basis for the Commission to take further action, as it may be deemed fit, under these regulations including the recommendation for withdrawal of institution deemed to be University status, to the Government.

42.5 Annual Reports, Annual Financial Statements, and Audit Reports shall be uploaded on the institution deemed to be University website and also on the Commission's portal, after due approval by the Executive Council.

43. Miscellaneous:

43.1 The institution deemed to be University shall, as soon as may be, after the completion of the academic programme, and in no case later than one hundred and eighty days from the date of such completion, ensure that the degree, diploma, certificate, or any other qualification in respect of the programme of studies, is awarded and made available to students.

43.2 The institutions deemed to be Universities shall compulsorily create Academic Bank of Credits (ABC), identities of their students and upload their credit scores in digital lockers and ensure that the credit scores are reflected in ABC portal and adopt Smart e-Gov.

(3) The institution deemed to be University shall not at any time enter into any franchise agreement or arrangement, either overtly or covertly, with any individual or organisation for establishing, maintaining, or operating the off-campus or off-shore campus or constituent units or course or programme of study or department or school or faculty of the institution deemed to be University except in the following cases, namely :—

(a) the institution deemed to be University, which is eligible under sub-regulations (1) and (2) of regulation 8 may enter into an agreement or arrangement, if—

(i) the establishment, maintenance, or operation of such institution is permitted under any Act of Parliament or the rules or regulations made there under; and
(ii) it has made an application under sub-regulation (3) of regulation 8, after following the procedure specified in these regulations

(b) the campus to be established under such agreement or arrangement shall be—

(i) treated as an off-campus centre of the institution deemed to be University as long as such agreement or arrangement remains valid under such law; and
(ii) subject to similar standards of audit and disclosure as a not-for-profit entity as that of the institution deemed to be University;

(c) the institution deemed to be University, which is eligible under regulation 8 may enter into an agreement or arrangement for a part-time training of students of a skill-oriented vocational courses, if such course is approved by the University Grants Commission or any other body established under an Act of Parliament.

(d) twinning Programmes, Joint Degree Programmes and Dual Degree Programmes shall be offered in accordance with the provisions stipulated in the University Grants Commission (Academic Collaboration between Indian and Foreign Higher Educational Institutions to offer Twinning, Joint Degree and Dual Degree Programmes) Regulations, 2022.

(e) the income and property of the institution deemed to be University shall be utilised solely for promoting the objectives of the institution deemed to be University.

(f) the Commission shall have the power to issue directions to an institution deemed to be University for implementation of any public policy of the Government or in respect of any law in force, including appropriate directions in case of any violation of any law or policy by the institution deemed to be University.

(g) no portion of the income and property of the institution deemed to be University shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly, by way of dividend, bonus, or otherwise how so ever by way of profit to the persons who were at any time or are members of the institution deemed to be University or to any of them or any persons claiming through them:

PROVIDED that nothing herein contained shall prevent the payment in good remuneration to any member thereof or another person as consideration for any services rendered by him to the institution deemed to be University.

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rendered to the institution deemed to be University or for traveling or other allowances and such other charges.

(h) in consultation with the Commission, the Government shall have the power to impose such other conditions, not inconsistent with these regulations, in the notification, and the same shall be binding on the institution deemed to be University.

(i) where the institution deemed to be University wishes to surrender its status of "institution deemed to be University", it shall do so with the prior permission of the Government; and similarly, withdrawal of any constituent units or off-campus or off-shore campus of the institution deemed to be University from the purview of an institution deemed to be University, shall require the sponsoring body to take the prior permission of the Government:

PROVIDED that such surrender or withdrawal, as the case may be, shall take effect only after the last batch of students on the rolls of the institution deemed to be University or its constituent units, as the case may be, have been accorded the opportunity to qualify for the completion of the programme of study and award of degree.

(j) the institution deemed to be University shall furnish to the Central Government or the Commission such returns or other information with respect to its property or activities as the Central Government or the Commission may, from time to time, require, within such period as may be prescribed by the Central Government or Commission.

(k) conventions of the institution deemed to be University for conferring the degrees or for other purposes shall be held in such manner as may be prescribed by the rules of the institution deemed to be University.

(l) the Executive Council may, by a resolution passed by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the members present and voting, withdraw a degree of academic distinction conferred on, or any certificate or diploma granted to, any person by the institution deemed to be University for good and sufficient cause:

PROVIDED that no such resolution shall be passed until a notice in writing has been given to that person calling upon him or her to show cause within such time as may be specified in the notice as to why such a resolution shall not be passed and until his or her objections, if any, and any evidence he or she may produce in support of them, have been considered by the Executive Council.

(m) in the event of conflict of opinion with regard to the interpretation of these regulations, the opinion of the Commission shall be final.



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- (e) the provisions contained in the University Grants Commission (Institutions deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2023 shall prevail in case of any inconsistency or conflicting provisions in any other regulations issued by the Commission under the provisions of the Act.

44. Legal Proceedings

44.1 The Registrar may sue or be sued for the purpose of any legal proceedings against institution deemed to be University, who shall have the power to enter into agreements, sign documents and authenticate records on behalf of the institution deemed to be University, and have the powers to exercise such powers and perform such duties under the provisions of these regulations.

44.2 No suit or legal proceedings shall lie against the Government or the Commission in respect of anything done or purported or intended to be done in pursuance of any of these regulations.

45. Consequences of the Violation of Regulations

In the event of non-compliance with the provisions as enumerated herein above or any other provisions as stipulated in the University Grants Commission (Institutions deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2023, the Institution shall be liable to be subjected to one or more of the following actions, namely:—

(a) for violation of these regulations established by the enquiry committee set up by the Commission or Government, the institution deemed to be University shall be warned in writing with public notice or barred from any expansion in terms of diversification to new courses or programmes of study or departments and establishment of off-campus or off-shore campuses, for a period of three years or as recommended by the enquiry committee, whichever is higher;

(b) continuous violation of regulations established by the enquiry committee set up by the Commission or the Government may result in closure of the courses or programmes of study or Departments and off campuses or constituent institutions or off-shore campuses or may result in withdrawal of the status of institution deemed to be University;

(c) in order to protect the interests of students in case of surrender or withdrawal of the status, as the case may be, shall take effect only after the last batch of students on the rolls of the institution deemed to be University or its constituent units, has been accorded opportunity to qualify for the completion of the programme of study and award of degree.



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46. Removal of Difficulty:

UGC reserves the right to remove difficulty(ies) in the course of implementation of this MoA in consultation with the Government of India, Ministry of Education.
